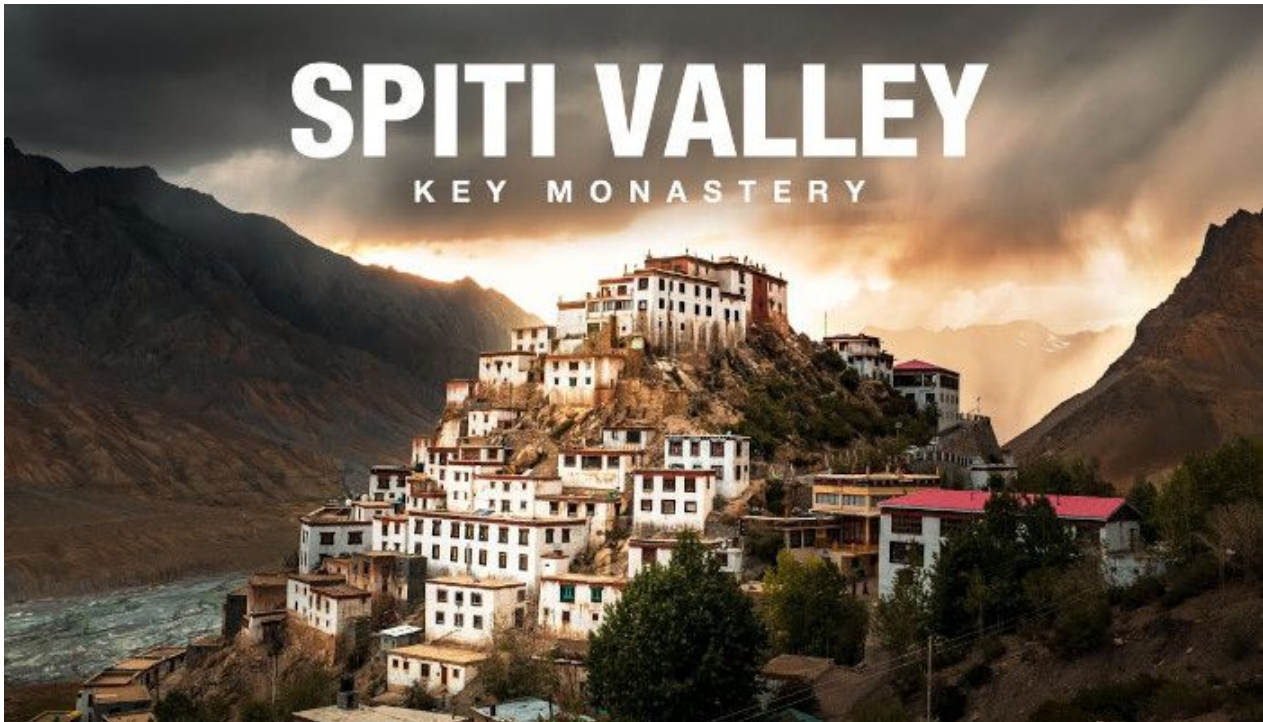

Spiti Valley is known as one of the coldest places in India and titles as “cold desert”. Remains covered by thick Himalayan snow Spiti valley travel remains cut off from the rest of the country for around 6 months. But the best month to visit Spiti Valley are of Summer months when it is accessible via car. This majestic cold desert valley is flourished with pine forests, green meadows, beautiful monasteries and inhabited villages which makes Spiti Valley tourism a stunning experience. 1. Key Monastery



Nestled among the breathtaking scenery of Himachal Pradesh is the crown jewel of the monasteries – Keegompa. 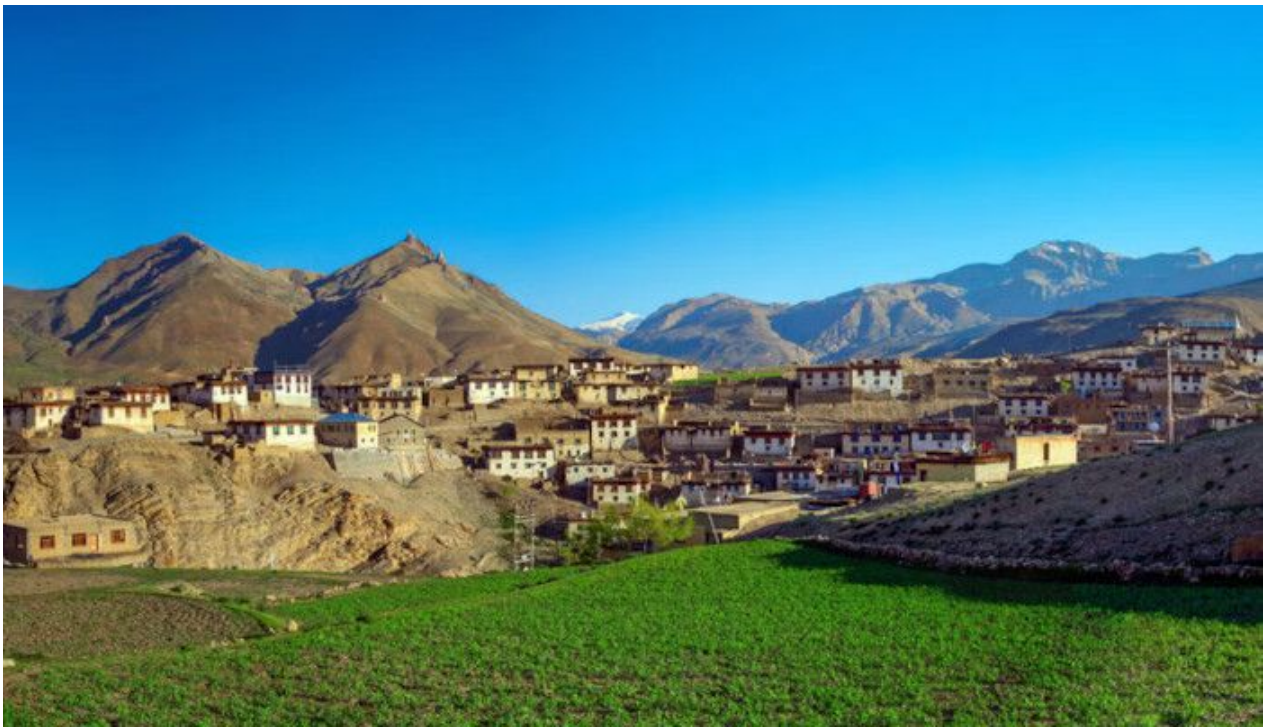
